Formatting:

- **❖ 1" margins** on all sides
- double space throughout, including quotations, notes and lists in works cited
- no title page
- first page should include the following, left justified and double-spaced, in this order:
 - o your name
 - o your instructor's name
 - o course number
 - o date
- Also include, centered title (do not underline or use quotation marks or all capital letters, unless the words would be written that way in the text)
- 5" header—include last name and page number right justified in the header on each page
- ❖ Works Cited (list of works used) or Works Consulted (list of works looked at)

Numbers:

- spell out numbers written in one or two words two, ninety-nine, two thousand, four million
- ❖ use numerals for numbers written in more than two words − 2½, 350, 12,543
- use numerals for numbers that precede technical units of measurement 2 inches, 3 amperes
- be consistent in number use Were 12 of the 127 in attendance?; He sold 3 shoes, 75 slacks, and 123 aprons.
- spell out any number that starts a sentence Three hundred forty-two students took the exam.
- use numerals for page numbers (page 7), percentages (7%), money (\$3.82), and addresses (301 State St.)

Titles:

- Italicize titles of independently published works which included books, plays, pamphlets, films, CDs, periodicals (newspapers, magazines, journals), and paintings.
- Quotation Marks are used for titles of works published within larger works such as articles, essays, chapters of books, and short stories or poems inside independently published works, episodes of television and radio programs, songs on an album, and scenes in films

In-text parenthetical citations:

- ❖ Print sources: Author's last name and page number—(Smith 3); if author's name appears in the sentence, just the page number is needed—Tannen has argued this point (178-85).
- Source with no author listed: Substitute a shortened form of the title for the author—(Report 34)
- Citing a source with no paginatation: Author's last name and chapter number or similar designation—(Douglas ch. 1)
- Online sources with paragraphs numbered in original: Author's last name and paragraph number (Smith par. 3)
- Online sources without paragraphs numbered in original: Author's last name only—(Smith)

Indirect source: If you are using a quotation that appeared in a source you are using; in other words, not the original quotation, but a quotation of a quotation.

- For a source mentioned in your text, use the abbreviation qtd. in According to Dewey, "..." (qtd. in Smith and Jones 318).
- For a source not mentioned in your text, use original source's name and qtd. in "..." (Dewey qtd in Smith and Jones 318).

All entries should be listed alphabetically by author.

Use HANGING INDENT (lower arrow in top margin ruler) to indent every line beyond the first in each entry. Omit articles (a, an, the) and business abbreviations (Co., Corp., Inc.) Use other standard abbreviations.
